Neuropsychologists currently work alongside pediatricians and DCN child psychologists to provide outpatient assessments for children, adolescents, and young adults in our main office in Arlington Heights, IL. Therapists see patients at our main location in Arlington Heights as well as in the primary care setting of our partner pediatricians in Crystal Lake, IL. The most frequent referrals for assessment pertain to anxiety, ADHD, autism spectrum disorder, neurologic disorders, and other medical conditions affecting development and cognition. Opportunity to conduct therapy or cognitive rehabilitation is available for those interested. This is a 1099 position with flexibility regarding part-time or full-time caseload and the option for W2 employment. Assessments are conducted Monday-Friday; weekend scheduling is also available for interested clinicians.

The Dirksen Center is an established and growing pediatrics-focused private practice located in Arlington Heights, IL, consisting of 6 doctoral-level psychologists (3 neuropsychologists), trainees, administrative staff, and practice managers.
